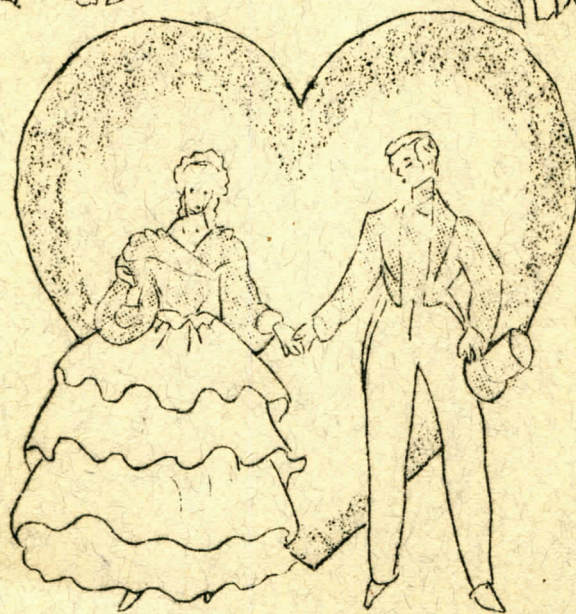
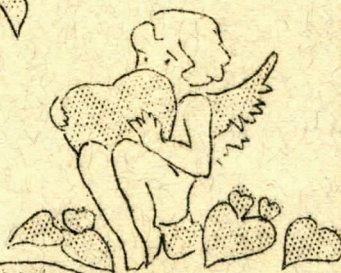

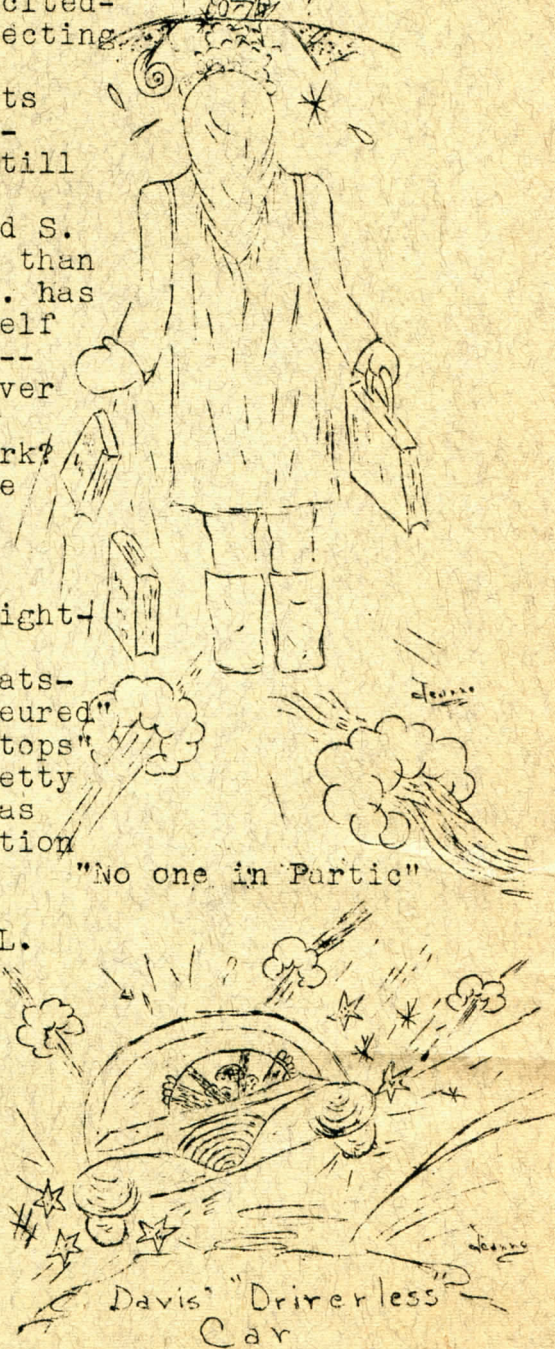
Wally P. to write oftener--so I 'me told--- he's in the army too--Verna's Delmer is still at Jefferson Barracks.
